Students with a primary major in the College of Business may qualify for a minor specialization in one of the college's departments by taking at least 15 credit hours in the minor specialization, 9 hours of which may not be used to satisfy any other department, college, or university requirement. The minor must include at least 6 credits in courses numbered 300 or above taken at Iowa State University with a grade of C or higher.

Minor in International Business

Select 12 credits from approved list in consultation with an Academic Advisor.

Select three additional credits from above, or other course as approved. Other courses must include a significant content representing the international or regional economic, political, legal, or non-US cultural context in which business is conducted.

One year sequence of a foreign language (minimum of 6 credits), and one College of Business Study tour course, OR a Study Abroad experience of at least 12 weeks in duration, with at least 12 credits of Business or cultural related courses, OR a Study Abroad experience of 6 weeks and 6 credits while in residence with a host family, OR an International Internship of at least 12 weeks in duration. Note: International students may take 6 credits of additional English or US Diversity course in lieu of language courses.

* Courses not offered on a regular basis

Students with declared majors will have priority over students with declared minors in courses with space constraints.
